Dr. Herman Havekes is a strategic advisor of the board and the management team in charge of (inter)national administrative matters at the Dutch Water Authorities. Since 1984, he has been employed by the Association of Regional Water Authorities (UvW) in The Hague. Herman was also affiliated to the Water Governance Centre (WGC) in The Hague (2011- March 2016). He holds a graduate degree in Dutch law from the University of Utrecht. He has produced several publications about water law and regional water authorities' law. Recent publications have been a second, edition of WGC booklet "Building blocks for good water governance" (www.watergovernancecentre.nl/publications) and a book on the Regional Water Authorities Act.



Jeroen Kool is Strategic Advisor at Royal HaskoningDHV, Board Member of the HaskoningDHV Foundation, Chairman of the Water Partner Foundation and "Ambassador" of the Netherlands Water Museum. Jeroen has a vast experience in developing and managing of large and multi-disciplinary water and environment related projects in the Middle East, Europe, Asia and North Africa. His work has focussed on development of integrated planning and management systems, strengthening international co-operation among riparian countries, and preparing water or environmental projects focusing on direct needs and solving urgent problems. He published and presented various papers at international conferences. Jeroen holds a M.Sc degree Geophysics and Hydrogeology at the University of Utrecht.



Peter van den Horn is the International Program Manager at the Netherlands Water Partnership; Peter oversees NWP activities in 23 countries in support of 200 companies, NGOs, knowledge institutes and government organisations from the Dutch water sector. His special focus is on sustainable urban delta management. Before joining NWP. Peter worked for the Dutch water company Vitens Evides International as a project adviser and country director Mozambique.



Henk van Schaik is the Water and Heritage Ambassador of the Netherlands ICOMOS Commission, member of the Technical Advisory Committee of the World Water Development Programme of UNESCO, Board Member of the Water Integrity Network Association in Berlin, Lead WATER of the UPEACE Centre The Hague, and regular advisor on water issues for the Government of Taiwan. He is co-editor of "Water and heritage, material, conceptual and spiritual connections" a book that was published by Sidestone, Netherlands. Henk holds an M.Sc degree in Sanitary Engineering from Wageningen University.



Frank Van der Valk is the Executive Director WIN. Frank joined in WIN in 2013 and became Executive Director in January 2014.
