PROPER USE OF THE HOUSEHOLD ARBORLOO AND FOSSA ALTERNA

Boys and men

Use the urinal for urination, as much as possible!

The content of the Arborloo or Fossa Alterna pit should remain as dry as possible!



Urine mixed with water (at least 1 to 1) is good for vegetable garden as it contains much plant nutrients (NPK). Apply it on 'loose' soil (not on plant leaves) and after sunset.

FOR USER: AFTER EVERY USE

- Add a good scoop/cup of dry ash to the pit; throw over the fresh faeces (keep a container with enough ash for a day inside latrine).
- Add a good scoop/cup of dry soil to the pit; throw over the fresh faeces (keep a container with enough dry soil for a day inside latrine).

EFFECTS:

- Ash keeps away the flies and other insects; it also reduces smell and it dries the faeces.
- 2. Dry soil dries the faeces and brings in micro-organisms that break down of the faeces and make it harmless.

FOR CARETAKER: EVERY OTHER DAY

- Add a good scoop /large cup of dry ash to the pit
- 2. Add a good scoop/large cup of dry soil to the pit
- Add two hands-full of dry leaves for a family latrine

General: keep a good stock of ash, dry soil and dry leaves in a small shed; and keep containers inside latrines filled up with ash and dry soil.



EFECTS: dry leaves allow oxygen and bacteria to help in composting of faeces.

FOR CARETAKER: EVERY MONTH

Spread/level the piled-up faeces over the entire pit surface using a stick (keep stick used for this job, put 'dirty' end into loose soil).

Spread a good amount of dry leaves over the levelled pit content, making a layer of a few centimetres of dry organic material (for composting).



FOR CARETAKER: WHEN PIT IS FILLED UP TO A LEVEL OF 40CM FROM SLAB

- 1. **Empty** the decomposed content of the 'old' pit of Fossa Alterna using a shovel; **use** 'humanure' in the garden as it is a very rich fertiliser.
- 2. **Shift latrine** 'house' and slab to next Arborloo or next pit of Fossa Alterna.
- 3. Close off old pit with a 10 cm layer of top soil.
- 4. For Arborloo: *Plant* any type of tree (and water daily); or *leave* pit content to decompose over a 12-month period, then *apply* fertile compost/humus to vegetable or flower garden.
